Boulder Right Up

In June 2023, a memorial plaque dedicated to Tom LaBonge, former CD 4 councilmember and lifelong Silver Lake resident who passed away in January 2021, was stolen and the boulder on which the plaque was placed damaged. A new memorial plaque and boulder, in honor of Tom, will be placed within the Silver Lake Reservoir Complex, at the northeast corner of the Ivanhoe Reservoir Walking Path, which is fenced and locked at night. Funding for the new memorial was made possible thanks to the generous donations of supporters, and SLT was able to secure a replacement plaque and boulder. The rededication will be private, for family members only.

While rogue shopping carts aren't the biggest issue facing Silver Lake, they are an excellent example of what it takes to navigate the bureaucracy of the city. By working TOGETHER we can make Silver Lake a better community.

"Thanks to an employee of the Sanitation Department, the rogue Home Depot shopping cart was removed on January 27. While on my morning walk, I saw a large green Sanitation truck delivering new trash cans. I shared my cart story with the driver, provided him with the location of the cart (it had been moved to the corner of West Silver Lake Drive and Moreno). The driver said he'd try to do something about it, and later that morning it was GONE! after 64 days of dealing with this irritating issue. Shame on the city, but thank you to the driver.
