CD 13 Organizes Special Vaccination Program to Make Scheduling Easier

Starting March 9, qualified residents of CD 13 will be eligible to receive both doses of the COVID-19 vaccination through an outreach program organized by CD 13 Councilmember Mitch O'Farrell. According to the latest update from the councilmember's office, individuals who are 65 and older, teachers, school staff, restaurant workers and others are eligible to receive the vaccines. CD 13's community outreach is designed to help residents avoid the sometimes confusing or conflicting information about signing up for the vaccine.



If you are interested in scheduling a COVID-19 vaccination through CD 13, complete the <u>Interest Form</u>, which will be used to determine eligibility. Once a person is deemed eligible, they will receive additional information. Vaccines will be administered at the Elysian Valley Recreation Center the weeks of March 9 (first vaccine) and March 29 (second vaccine).

Updates from Tony Michaelis, Transportation and City Services Advocate

Tony Michaelis, Silver Lake resident and Streets LA (BSS) Advisory Council member, is sharing valuable information about upcoming city projects with readers of Silver Lake Together. First up: due to COVID-19 financial restraints, Streets LA is modifying its street sweeping program, moving from weekly sweepings to every other week. Effective March 1, residents can sign up to get email notification of when streets will be swept. Notifications will be sent 24 to 48 hours in advance, giving residents a chance to move their cars. While many streets in Silver Lake are residential and not swept often, the new guidelines also apply to surrounding throughfares and communities. Tony will use his experience to advocate to bring more city services to Silver Lake and provide up-to-date information to our community.

Senior Meals Program Extended



Thanks to action by CD 13 Councilmember Mitch O'Farrell, the Los Angeles' Senior Meals Emergency Program, which provides home-delivered, healthy meals to seniors, is extended to March 31. In a newsletter, Councilmember O'Farrell noted he recognizes that seniors still face many risks even and that the program is a special passion of his. CD 13 is also working to create a new <u>program</u> that doubles a previous rent subsidy by prioritizing <u>\$243 million in state and federal dollars</u> to help keep people housed and small apartment building owners from going bankrupt. The framework is in committee and will be heard by the full city council.
